**OLP BASKETBALL UPDATE:** Sign-ups are open for the 2018-19 OLP basketball season (3rd-8th Grade). 4th-8th Grade students can register at [plkc.org](http://plkc.org).

**3rd Grade Basketball:** 3rd graders will be playing in a separate league that will allow them to play together as a class and in a league with rules more appropriate for their age. Please plan to have your 3rd grade student attend one of our 3rd grade evaluation sessions mentioned below.

**Evaluations:** 6th-8th Grade: Evaluations for 6th-8th grade are **October 20th**. One-hour evaluation sessions will be scheduled in a window from 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. These grade levels have two evaluation sessions that last one-hour each (Students are encouraged to attend two sessions, but only one is required). Evaluation sessions will be at Pleasant Lea Middle School.

3rd-5th Grade: Kids will run through stations that evaluate different skills such as shooting, footwork and dribbling. These evaluations last 15-30 minutes depending on how much help we have evaluating. Kids only need to attend one evaluation. Evaluations for 3rd-5th Grade will be held **October 16<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup>** from 7:15 p.m. to 8:45 p.m.
